A Mother’s Love Is God's Gracious Gift

A mother’s loving, nurturing presence is important for a child. She heals, restores, guides, and strengthens her children to help them grow and flourish. But not all children are blessed with this kind of love and support when they are brought into the world.

As the director of an Angels Of Hope donor-supported home in Honduras, Patricia, lovingly called “Paty” by the children in her care, knows how important it is for a child to have a mother figure in their life because she sees the pain of neglect and abandonment in the faces of the children who are placed in her AOH home.

“Every human being needs a person who loves them, who guides them and whose footsteps we can follow,” she said. And she has made it her life’s work to “be able to make the children feel good, that they are loved, and they are important in this world.”

Through the Angels Of Hope program, children

living in donor-supported homes receive the care they desperately need from a tight-knit community that includes mother figures who love them as if they were their own. The children develop close bonds with teachers, supervisors, physicians, the women who cook their meals and other women in their lives who form a circle of understanding, love and protection.

“I welcome each child with open arms, I’m there for them at every moment, and also, they call me Mom,” she said. “I’m the one who gives them the hope that every child can become someone in life and the one who fights for them to make their dreams come true.”

Paty delights in being called Mom and in showing the children how much they are loved and how important they are in the world. “If they are in this place, it’s because God has a great purpose for them,” she said.

For 17-year-old Lency, Paty’s presence has been life-changing. “She’s the one who is with me in hard and easy times,” Lency said. “She’s the one who inspires

me to keep going and never give up.”

Through God's grace, and the support of Food For The Poor donors, these children are blessed with women like Paty who devote themselves to helping children reach their God-given potential. For their part, the women are thankful for the opportunity to help nurture young lives.

The love Paty's children have for her was on full display when she returned to the children's home after a recent trip. On her office door were beautiful decorations including a message that read in Spanish: “Bienvenida Mama La Queremos,” which means “Welcome Mama We Love You.”

“I’m very grateful because I have the privilege of being able to play the role of a mother for those who don’t have one,” Paty said.

Johanne, AOH manager of a children's home in Haiti, said the children’s emotional development is at risk and caring is urgent when they arrive at one of the donor-supported homes. “In a sense, they were

abandoned by their own parents because they were unable to provide for them,” she said. “It's not easy for a child to deal with that.”

The children in her home call Johanne “Manmie Jo,” a name she cherishes because it indicates a strong family bond. “Children need an adult mother figure in their lives,” she said. “It is important for the children to see that someone cares and worries about them.”

Johanne goes on to explain: “My destiny was to be a mother to the children in my home. I have always been a person who cares for the less fortunate. There is no doubt that God sent me; it is a ministry to be taken seriously.”
