

Food For The Poor Fast Facts

- ☞ Celebrating its 43rd year, Food For The Poor is an interdenominational Christian relief and development organization working primarily in 15 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean.
- ☞ Since its inception, Food For The Poor has provided more than \$18.7 billion in aid.
- ☞ Since its inception in 1982, the charity has shipped more than 104,248 tractor-trailer loads, including 988 loads shipped during the first six months of 2025.
- ☞ Food For The Poor provides assistance in 10 distinct focus areas, including hunger relief and nutrition; water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH); agriculture and food security; community development; education; economic empowerment; health; emergency preparedness and response; outreach to vulnerable groups; and child well-being.
- ☞ Our theory of change is rooted in a commitment to facilitate paths out of poverty and into transformed lives by collaborating with partners to bring broad social transformation that addresses each country's urgent needs through humanitarian relief and sustainable development initiatives.
- ☞ Over the course of our 2025-2027 strategic plan, we are focusing our programs on six priority countries: Haiti, Jamaica, Honduras, Guatemala, El Salvador, and Colombia. Mexico, Ecuador, and Peru have emerged as important expansion territories for Food For The Poor, due to the prevalence of concentrated regions of severe impoverishment, substantial diaspora communities in the United States, and the availability of reliable partner organizations.
- ☞ Since the charity's inception through 2024, Food For The Poor donors have built 96,381 safe and secure homes for children and families in need through the first eight months of 2025.
- ☞ In 2024, FFTP completed 23 projects, benefiting 84,950 people. Currently, there are 13 ongoing projects expected to benefit approximately 213,711 people.
- ☞ Angels Of Hope, our child sponsorship program, offers safe havens for vulnerable children who have faced extreme poverty, abandonment, abuse, or the threat of human trafficking. Angels Of Hope is sponsoring 8,228 children living in 87 children's homes in Haiti, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Colombia, and Peru, where they receive food, clothing, shelter, education, and love.
- ☞ Food For The Poor is currently implementing 16 sustainable community development projects, with locations in Guatemala, Colombia, El Salvador, and Honduras. Sustainable community development projects, which typically take about five years to complete, involve identifying and addressing economic, social, and spiritual challenges in a community, and empowering families to be self-sufficient

and able to thrive long-term. Since 2019, FFTP has completed four sustainable community projects, bringing the total to 20 completed or in progress.
